

NCUA Incident Report

1. Call Assignor to report any ejection immediately after the game
2. Record facts on the lineup cards before leaving the site
3. Download and Complete the Incident Report as soon as possible after the game describing
 - Inning and general game statistics
 - Describe facts relevant to the incident – be factual (no personal judgments)
 - Reference Rules relevant to support umpire's ruling
4. Print and mail, or email completed Incident Report to Baseball VP and Assignor, Don Simon (dls94015@yahoo.com) as soon as possible after the game.

example: The Balboa batter, A. Arnold (#20), popped out to second base for the final out of the inning. After reaching first base, the batter-runner (#20) deliberately removed his helmet and slammed it into the ground in front of U1. Earlier in the game, after a Balboa player removed his helmet during live play on the field, the UIC warned the Balboa coach and bench that the next player to remove his helmet would be ejected. The team were warned about removing their helmet during play.

Game status at time of incident:

example: The bottom of the sixth inning with the bases loaded and 2 outs

Describe Umpire ruling (Rules applied to make the call):

After a brief discussion with UIC and U1, it was determined that the player's action was in fact a "deliberate" act, so we enforced Rule 3-3-1m. As a result, player #20 was ejected from the game.
